To Tenet workers in Massachusetts:

Fifteen thousand members of the National Union of Healthcare Workers stand in solidarity with you in your fight with Tenet Healthcare Corporation.

In California we represent nearly a thousand workers at three Tenet hospitals, where we are fighting for safe staffing, affordable health care, and a livable wage.

While Tenet's frontline workers risked their lives during the COVID-19 pandemic, Tenet made \$400 million in profits in 2020, and received \$2.5 billion from the federal government in CARES Act and other pandemic relief. These funds were intended to help hospitals cover expenses and losses caused by the pandemic. Instead, Tenet used those federal dollars to finance acquisitions and enrich executives, prompting Congresswomen Katie Porter of California and Rosa DeLauro of Connecticut to call for a federal investigation of Tenet and other healthcare corporations for misuse of Provider Relief Funds.

Tenet is a greedy corporation focused on its profits, not its patients or its workers. The hidden costs of those profits are understaffed and unsafe hospitals and underpaid workers, many of whom have had to fight on the frontlines against COVID without health insurance.

Your fight is just and it is noble, and we stand with you every step of the way.
